# OXNARD FOREBAY ISDS (SEPTIC SYSTEMS) REPAIR PERMITS


On May 11, 2001 the Los Angeles Regional Water Quality Control Board's amendment to the Water Quality Control Plan for the Los Angeles Region became effective. This amendment prohibits the installation of new septic systems and the expansion of existing systems on parcels less than 5 acres located in the Oxnard Forebay. The Oxnard Forebay includes the communities of El Rio, Strickland Track, and parts of Saticoy and Oxnard City. The amendment also specifies that by January 1, 2008 sewage discharges from septic systems in the Oxnard Forebay will be prohibited.

As a result of this action, the Environmental Health Division (EHD) cannot issue permits to install new septic systems or expand existing systems in the Oxnard Forebay.

Before the EHD can process a permit to repair an existing system, a completed plot plan (located on the reverse side) must be included with the application for a repair permit.

All septic system construction permits shall be approved by the EHD before commencement of construction.

## ADVISORY NOTICE SEPTIC SYSTEMS IN THE OXNARD FOREBAY

The Oxnard Forebay is generally located in the El Rio and Saticoy areas of Western Ventura County (see map on reverse side). It is an area where surface water can percolate unimpeded down to underground aquifers that provide drinking water supplies for residences and businesses located on the Oxnard plain. Consequently, the aquifers can be contaminated by activities that occur at or near the ground level in the Forebay area.

The Los Angeles Regional Water Quality Control Board (LARWQCB) is the State agency responsible for protecting the quality of groundwater and surface water throughout most of Ventura County. This agency has determined that septic system discharges are a major source of contamination that could adversely impact groundwater quality in the Oxnard Forebay. Therefore, on August 12, 1999, the LARWQCB adopted Resolution No. 99-13 which prohibits new or expanded septic systems in the Oxnard Forebay on lots of less than 5 acres. The resolution also requires use of all existing septic systems end by January 1, 2008. This order was ratified by the State Water Resources Control Board on May 11, 2001 and is currently in effect. As a result of this action, the Environmental Health Division will no longer issue permits to install new septic systems or to expand existing septic systems in the Oxnard Forebay.
