

Note: The following is a summary of actions taken by the Cultural Heritage Board (CHB) at their public hearing and not a verbatim transcription.

1. 1:15 P.M. CONVENE THE MEETING OF THE VENTURA COUNTY CULTURAL HERITAGE BOARD

Due to the absence of the Chair and Vice Chair, Dillan Murray, staff, called the meeting to order and opened the floor for any nominations for Acting Chair. Board Member Blum nominated Board Member Angelini to serve as Acting Chair. Board Member Cline seconded the motion. Motion passed 4-0.

2. ROLL CALL AND DETERMINATION OF A QUORUM

3. APPROVAL OF AGENDA

3a. Vote to approve the September 22, 2025, Agenda

Board Member Blum made a motion to approve the September 22, 2025, Agenda. Board Member Cline seconded the motion. Motion passed 4-0.

4. <u>NEW BUSINESS</u>

4a. Action: Receive a presentation from Betsy J. Green, an experienced writer and historian, who will explore the dramatic history of local wildfires. Her presentation, "From Buckets to Bulldozers: Wildfires Then and Now," will compare the Great Forest Fires of 1917 with the Thomas Fire of 2017, offering insight into how fire response has evolved over the past century. The presentation is the first part in the new Cultural Heritage Board guest speaker series, *Ventura County Chronicles: Fire, Freight & Freeways*.

Presentation: Board Members Angelini and Gooch introduced Ms. Green and noted that the session is the first part in the Cultural Heritage Board's new speaker series titled "Ventura County Chronicles: Fire, Freight & Freeways." The intent of the series is to bring to life the important events,

influential people, and key infrastructure developments that have shaped Ventura County's history. Ms. Green presented a historical overview of local wildfires through a comparison of the Great Forest Fires of 1917 with the devastating Thomas Fire of 2017, including a look at the conditions that preceded each fire and the technology used to extinguish the flames.

Discussion and Deliberation:

Following Ms. Green's presentation, a Question-and-Answer session was held with members of the audience.

7. <u>APPROVAL OF PREVIOUS MEETING MINUTES</u>

7a. Vote to approve the August 25, 2025, Meeting Minutes

Board Member Cline made a motion to approve the August 25, 2025, Meeting Minutes. Board Member Gooch seconded the motion. Motion passed 4-0.

8. REPORTS

8a. Board Member Reports

Board Member Blum reported on his own use of online newspaper archives and historic aerial imagery, similar to the guest speaker, as valuable sources of information over the course of his involvement with Heritage Square in Oxnard.

Board Member Angelini reported on a few upcoming events in Simi Valley, including the Hispanic Heritage Festival on September 27th, the Cops N' Cruisers Car Show on September 28th, and the Oktoberfest Festival on October 4th.

8b. CHB Program Updates from Staff

Dillan Murray, staff, reported that the next expected hearing will be Monday, October 13th.

Next, Mr. Murray reported that staff recently completed the 5-year inspections for Mills Act contract holders across the City of Oxnard and the unincorporated areas. As part of this, staff inspects to verify work items are being completed, and identifies additional maintenance that may be needed. One example is the residence at 102 North F Street in the Henry T Oxnard District. In 2022, staff identified visible wear and chipping at exterior windows and doors, shingle siding that was faded and damaged, and dry rot in some areas. The property was again inspected this year, and substantial repairs were completed, including the repair of the perimeter fence, repaint of the entire exterior, repair of exterior wood windows and doors, reshingle of the east side of garage, refinish of the front door, and repair of dry rot. This case is a good demonstration of reinvestment in a property that is benefiting from Mills Act property tax savings.

Next, Mr. Murray reported that the property owner of one of the contributing parcels to the Tony Duquette Historic District, located in the Santa Monica Mountains, recently commissioned architectural historian Daniel Paul to develop a report on the interior character-defining features of the horse stables complex at the property. The report has been added to the district case file and will help guide any future projects or Mills Act application at the property.

Next, Mr. Murray reported that the Ventura County chapter of the Japanese American Citizens League recently won an Award of Excellence from the American Association for State and Local History for the rededication and revitalization of the historic Japanese American Cemetery, which CHB staff happily provided a letter of support for. This comes in addition to the Historic Preservation Award that the CHB granted the group this past May. In related news, Dr. Lily Welty Tamai, a local academic who is involved in the chapter, is conducting research into a block of commercial buildings at the southwestern corner of the intersection of Oxnard Boulevard and 7th Street and across from the Asahi Market in Oxnard. The buildings were historically owned and occupied by Japanese American residents and business owners, and Dr. Tamai's goal is to see them designated as some sort of historic commercial district in the future with plagues or interpretative options incorporated into the storefronts or public sidewalk.

Finally, Mr. Murray reported that some projects on the horizon include the proposed rehabilitation of a residence at 421 S G Street in Oxnard and a proposed landmark and Mills Act contract for an apartment court at 119-127 D Street, also in Oxnard. Both cases are scheduled to be reviewed at the October 13th hearing. A site visit is scheduled to be at the apartment court in the morning, while the hearing will be held nearby in Oxnard. Final details will be announced soon.
