

1924 Timber School Building

This school was designed by the first licensed architect in Ventura County, Roy C. Wilson, in 1924. It replaced the 1889 wood-framed school that had been located on this site. The concrete structure was built in the Mission Revival style featuring a cupola which contained a working school bell. The design included electricity and indoor plumbing, making it the first public building in Conejo Valley to include these amenities.

At first an elementary school, this building later housed district offices and served as the Conejo Valley High School. It is the oldest original standing public building in the Conejo Valley.
