

## **1924 Timber School Building**

**This school was designed by the first licensed architect in Ventura County, Roy C. Wilson, in 1924. It replaced the 1889 wood-framed school that had been located on this site. The concrete structure was built in the Mission Revival style featuring a cupola which contained a working school bell. The design included electricity and indoor plumbing, making it the first public building in Conejo Valley to include these amenities.**

**At first an elementary school, this building later housed district offices and served as the Conejo Valley High School. It is the oldest original standing public building in the Conejo Valley.**
