SECTION I

OVERVIEW

Preservation Activities in Ventura County - Fillmore

The Ventura County Cultural Heritage Ordinance was adopted in 1967 by the Board of Supervisors and reenacted in 1973 (Ordinance No. 2737). The Cultural Heritage Board was created by that Ordinance and acts as the Preservation Board for all of the Cities (incorporated areas) and the County unincorporated areas, except for Cities of Ventura and Camarillo. The City of Ventura has its own Historic Preservation Commission and the City of Camarillo is currently unrepresented by an official preservation board. Each participating City in the County has adopted the Cultural Heritage Board's Ordinance or modifications thereof to meet their particular needs.

The primary purpose of the Ordinance is to "promote the economic and general welfare of the County of Ventura by preserving and protecting landmarks and monuments having a specific historical or aesthetic character or interest". The Cultural Heritage Board recommends landmark designation to the City Council or the Board of Supervisors, who, in turn, make the final designation.

The County Property Administration Agency serves as administrative staff to the Cultural Heritage Board and provides minimal program coordination for the landmark designation program. The Survey Grant program was pursued in an attempt to expedite the landmark designation program and to allow the program to pursue aggressive preservation efforts.

The City of Fillmore has its own Fillmore Historical Museum and Fillmore Historical Society. The Society participated in the Survey by providing a space in the museum for the Survey office and providing volunteers to work on the Survey.

Events Leading Up to the Survey

The Survey Grant was prepared in the Spring of 1981 for the second phase of the Cultural Heritage Survey to take place in Fillmore, and a second phase for Santa Paula and Oxnard. The grant was written for \$20,000, but only \$5,000 was received. It was decided initiate a new area with this amount and Fillmore was chosen.

Developmental History of Fillmore

Fillmore was established as a railroad town by the Southern Pacific in 1887 when they built a depot and named the town after a railroad official, J. P. Fillmore. Growth was slow, with only 150 people living in Fillmore in 1900. The town was centered around the railroad depot on Main Street with

Survey Coordinator, Judy Triem, was hired in September 1982. At this time survey handbooks were prepared. Training sessions for volunteers were held in October and the Survey began immediately with approximately 20 volunteers.

Volunteers photographed every structure within the Survey boundaries and an architectural and historical worksheet was prepared for the majority of structures and all of the significant structures by both volunteers and the Survey Coordinator. A list of volunteers is included.

The photographs and written material were then evaluated by the Project Review Committee using adopted criteria. The results are contained in this report. Members of the Project Review Committee were: Dorothy Haase, Jeannette Anderson and Judy Triem, Survey Coordinator. Alternates were Harold and Theycal Dorman.

III. The Historic Resources Inventory

The information contained in this report (appendix) has been prepared on State Inventory Forms under State Office of Historic Preservation guidelines.

The Historic Resources Inventory Forms are prepared in one of two ways; as neighborhood designations or

VENTURA COUNTY CULTURAL RESOURCES SURVEY FILLMORE

I. Introduction

The following information is the result of a comprehensive historical and architectural building survey conducted in the Fillmore area from September 1982 to May 1983. A map that follows illustrates the survey boundaries. The material presented here is in the format required by the State Office of Historic Preservation. A complete report of the Survey, which discusses methods, organization and recommendations, is available as a separate document.

II. Background

The County of Ventura, City of Fillmore and the Ventura County Cultural Heritage Board sponsored the Survey under a matching grant from the State Office of Historic Preservation.

The long-range goal of the Cultural Heritage Board is to survey the entire County with Phase I taking place in Oxnard and Santa Paula, and Phase II taking place in Fillmore.





some building beginning to occur Central Avenue. East of the depot, on Main Street, several warehouses and fruit packing houses began to appear to accommodate the citrus industry that was developing in Fillmore and corrals were built for the cattle that were raised in the nearby areas. The Cottage Hotel was located on Main and Fillmore Streets and served as an early boarding house. In 1895, there were three general merchandise stores owned by C. A. Harmonson, Duncan and Stephens, and Smith Brothers.

Much of the land was owned by the Sespe Land and Water Company, who gradually sold off parcels to ranchers who began raising lemons and oranges. After 1910, large parcels began to be subdivided for housing which occurred, somewhat randomly at first, between A Street on the west to Mountain View on the east and 2nd Street on the north to Ventura Street (Hwy 126) on the south. Some of the earliest subdivisions were the Alcock and Stowe and Goodenough Tracts.

The town of Fillmore was incorporated in 1914, and in that same year, some 50 houses were built, many in the Elkins Tract which had begun development ca 1912. The Central Avenue business district began to change from wood frame houses and buildings to one and two story commercial brick buildings. In 1911, there were 4 brick structures, and by 1918 there were 18 brick buildings. The growth of the

business district was related not just to the rising citrus industry, but to the discovery of oil and the opening of the Texaco Refinery in the Pole Creek area.

The majority of the early structures in Fillmore in the Survey area remaining today are primarily from 1910 through 1930. The majority are California Bungalows and commercial brick structures from the late teens and 1920's. There are perhaps ten or so structures remaining built prior to 1910, a few which have been moved from the Central Avenue business district. Fillmore has not had any redevelopment projects where buildings have been demolished and there has been very little demolition of structures in the City, except for the early wood frame buildings on Central Avenue that were replaced with brick structures. Also, most of the railroad section housing and Japanese and Mexican labor housing was torn down.

The remainder of the Survey area filled in during the 1930's and 1940's with single family residences from that period. These streets were basically those north of 3rd Street.

SECTION II

STATEMENT OF PURPOSE

The primary reason for undertaking the Countywide Survey was to have a comprehensive inventory of historical, architectural and cultural resources in the County. This would provide a basis for decisions by the Cultural Heritage Board and the City Councils and the Board of Supervisors as to the continued declaration of landmarks and possible landmark districts in the County. It would also serve as a planning tool for local governments when making decisions as to zoning and rehabilitation of older areas. Finally, its purpose was to educate the general public by giving them the opportunity to participate as volunteers and to have the information available to the public in final form.

Phase II included the City of Fillmore because of the immediate availability of volunteers, the richness of resources and the willingness of the local government to participate.

The County of Ventura entered into an agreement with the State of California Department of Parks and Recreation on September 10, 1982, to do a comprehensive block-by-block survey in the City of Fillmore beginning October 1, 1982 and ending May 31, 1983.

Sections of the community that were surveyed are shown on maps found in the Appendix. All buildings in the Survey area were included, although little or no research was done on post 1940 buildings, structures and objects of historical, architectural and cultural significance.

SECTION III

METHODS USED

Time and Organization of Survey Project

A total of nine months was spent on the Survey Project. In September, a Volunteer Handbook was prepared by the Survey Coordinator. A separate handbook was prepared on the identification of buildings and an additional handbook on how to do historical research. This method helped cut costs of printing, for many people who did the architectural fieldwork did not do the research, so they only needed one book.

During this first month <u>publicity</u> was also initiated to get volunteers. The Fillmore Historical Museum had done an early recruitment using the newspaper, the <u>Fillmore Herald</u>. Also, personal contacts were made to enlist those in the community who had lived in Fillmore all their lives and were familiar with the area. A general press release was sent out to all newspapers and radio stations announcing the Survey and Training Session.

The first Training Session was held in October and was given by consultant Mitchel Stone, who discussed Fillmore's architectural styles using slides. The Survey Coordinator introduced the Survey and its goals. Following this Saturday

morning session, a walking tour of the neighborhood was held to give fieldworkers a chance to use the architectural field sheet and describe a building. Assignments on a block basis were given to volunteers following this session. Several volunteers worked in pairs. As assignments were completed, new areas were given out.

Several of the volunteers were interested only in photography and assignments were given out in October with completion in April.

In November, a training session was held for those interested in research and as the field sheets came in, those areas were assigned to research.

A training session was held in January for high school history students. These students had a lecture on Fillmore's architectural styles by the Survey Coordinator and were assigned a block. These students worked in pairs and were given three weeks to complete their assignments. Many did not finish.

The majority of fieldwork was completed in April and the research done by May. Several of the structures did not have the fieldwork done on them.

The Project Review Committee began their meetings in January and would meet every other week to start. The last month they met once every week.

The Survey completion date was May 31, 1983, but an extension of two weeks was granted to finish the final Survey forms, and complete the written report.

Personnel

The Project Coordinator was hired by the County of Ventura as a part-time paid staff person. The Coordinator was Judy Triem, who holds a Master's Degree in History from the University of California, Santa Barbara. She had previous experience working on Phase I of the Ventura County Survey in Oxnard and Santa Paula and on the Ventura City and Santa Barbara Surveys. Her background in the field of Historic Preservation included seven years on the Ventura Historic Preservation Commission, two years as Chairperson and an internship with the National Trust for Historic Preservation.

The other paid staff person was Mitchel Stone, who served as a consultant on the project. His background includes previous Survey experience on the Pasadena, Fullerton and Oxnard/Santa Paula Surveys. He is currently an Urban Planner with the City of Oxnard.

The remainder of personnel were volunteers.

Selection of Boundaries and Criteria

The boundaries selected for the Fillmore Survey were chosen based on the age of the structures and the time allowed to complete the Survey. The oldest section of the City with the largest concentration of the buildings built prior to 1940, including the downtown commercial area, was chosen as the primary area.

The criteria used for making the final selection of buildings is based on the National Register Criteria which is included in the Appendix.

Number of Buildings and How they were Surveyed and Researched In Fillmore, approximately 824 structures were surveyed and 292 are contained in the final inventory.

The Survey was accomplished by walking block-by-block. A photograph was taken of the majority of structures and research and architectural worksheets were prepared for the majority of structures.

Properties of historic and cultural significance were discovered and researched using several methods. Primarily, the Sanborn Maps (1895-1929), the City Directories (1898-1912)

and the 1912 Ventura County Historical Atlas provided the written basis for the dates of construction and ownership and occupation of owners. The list of architectural plans for Fillmore available at the Ventura County Historical Museum were used to try and identify the architect and date of Fillmore's earliest buildings. The Fillmore Herald was perused for certain early years (1907-1914) and information was discovered on the dates of certain buildings, builders and historical development of the City. The County Master Assessor's Property File was used, but found to be not that accurate for original date of construction and owner. It did list some ownership (date unknown) and a possible early date of construction (often found wrong).

For more detailed information on individuals and owners of property, many local residents were interviewed. This supplemental information was quite helpful in filling in the gaps and sometimes was the only information we could find on certain property owners. Those who provided assistance had been Fillmore residents most of their lives and were able to recall the appropriate dates and names associated with the early buildings.

Project Review Committee

A Project Review Committee was chosen. This Committee selected the list of structures for the State Inventory of

Historic Resources, evaluated these structures for National Register status and compiled a list of potential County Landmarks or Landmark Districts. The composition of the Committee is as follows:


Jeannette Anderson has lived in Fillmore all her life and has been an active member of the community. Her father, C. W. Harthorne, was a judge and businessman in Fillmore for many years. Jeannette is currently serving on the Planning Commission for the City of Fillmore and represents that aspect of Planning on the Committee. She is also an active member of the Fillmore Historical Society.

Dorothy Haase, long time Fillmore resident, has also been active in the community. She currently serves on the Board of Directors of the Fillmore Historical Society and has been instrumental in the development of the Fillmore Historical Museum.

Harold and Theycal Dorman served as alternate members of the committee. Both are long time Fillmore and Bardsdale residents. Harold Dorman's family were Bardsdale pioneer ranchers.

Project Costs

The total project costs were \$5,000. The total grant was for \$5,000 to be matched by volunteer time, etc.



SECTION IV

FINAL RESULTS

Comprehensiveness of Survey

The Survey was a comprehensive inventory of all structures in the central and oldest section of Fillmore (see map in Appendix). The number and category of buildings selected for the State Historic Resources Inventory are as follows:

The total number of buildings surveyed in Fillmore was approximately 824, with the majority being residential. The remainder were commercial, except for 16 in the cultural category which included churches, schools, clubs, etc.

A Master List by street and address of the buildings selected for the inventory is included in the Appendix.

Balance between Historically, Architecturally and Culturally Significant Buildings

There is a fairly even balance between the historically and architecturally significant buildings. Many of the residential buildings were submitted as neighborhoods because of their consistency of style - primarily California Bungalows. In addition, the neighborhoods derived historical importance from the original owners. Many of Fillmore's influential early leaders and businessmen lived in these neighborhoods, whereas some neighborhoods were important as examples of workers' housing.

There were a large number of buildings that were identified as being important culturally, and these included many churches, schools, the Masonic Temple, the Fillmore Park and the Fillmore sign.

New Information Uncovered about the History, Settlement, Architects and Building Styles of the Survey Area

There has been no developmental history written about Fill-more's early settlement within the Survey area. All of the information collected in the inventory of this area will perhaps contribute to the compilation of a history of Fillmore.

The physical development of the City occurred around the establishment of the railroad in 1887 on Main Street near Central Avenue. The Southern Pacific owned a large parcel of land located between Main and Santa Clara on which they built the depot. The earliest buildings were constructed on Main Street and Central Avenue with several early residences built on the 300 block of Central Avenue in the 1890's. Later, after 1900, this block became totally commercial and the houses were either moved or demolished.

Settlement of the area by businessmen and ranchers began slowly at first, with the first subdivisions ca 1907 occurring on Olive Street, Palm Street and Orange Grove below Santa Clara Street. Ranchers began to make inroads in the City and began buying land on Sespe Avenue for citrus production.

With the incorporation of the town in 1914, Fillmore began to grow and development east of Central Avenue began in earnest. Many influential citizens and businessmen had houses built on Fillmore and Saratoga Streets in the 400 block.

Early settlement by farmworkers included many Mexican families and Japanese. On Main Street, about a block east of the depot, housing was built for these transitional workers. It is alleged that there is one example of railroad section

housing left that once belongs to the foreman. This house is located at 137 Main Street. Another house at 403-405 Main Street resembles the labor housing used by the Japanese and Mexicans with several entrances on the sides of the building.

The major builders during this period included the firm of Hastings and Yeakle. They were building in Fillmore as early as 1910 through the 1930's. Their residences were located next door to each other on Santa Clara Street, and they ran a planning mill behind their house. Other early builders were Samuel C. Edwards and Family, Mr. Dorn, "Windy" Smith, Mr. Myers, Carl Seichert, to name a few.

Some of the schools and large commercial buildings were designed by L. A. architects. Albert C. Martin designed the Fillmore State Bank and Homer Glidden did the Masonic Temple, plus several other commercial buildings on Central Avenue. The Sespe School was designed by Frank L Schalflex, E. L. Moore and R. Jeffer. Roy C. Wilson, Santa Paula architect, designed the church on the corner of Central and First Streets.

The majority of buildings in the Survey area were constructed between 1912 and 1930. The prevailing architectural style for residences was the California Bungalow. In commercial structures, 1920's brick facades were common. Several of

these structures have been modernized over time with new window treatments, stucco applied over brick, and a few had second stories removed due to earthquake damage. There are a few remaining residences built ca 1895 to 1907 which have elements of the Victorian and Colonial Revival Styles. A late version of the Mission Style is seen in the Sespe School (now the Fillmore School District Office). There are also several neighborhoods that have Period Revival styles of the 1920's, including Mediterranean and English cottage and Tudor styles. A few commercial buildings from the 1930's and early 1940's have simplified Streamlined Moderne styles.

SECTION V

RECOMMENDATIONS

The value of any study can be partially measured by the action it generates. The valuable data collected and compiled through this Survey is only useful if it is properly institutionalized and documented for accuracy.

The information collected from this Survey is invaluable to the local jurisdiction only if the recommendations contained in this section can be implemented.

The entire Survey project, including the initial planning done before the actual survey began, offers three major opportunities. These include: 1) Landmark Designation Program Procedural Policy, 2) Educational Uses, and 3) Planning Uses.

1. Landmark Designation Program Procedural Policy

The current County Cultural Heritage Program is in fact a Landmark Designation Program. It is a survey process though not necessarily done in a consistent nor organized manner. The information available is not included in the educational nor planning process. Some declared

landmarks have little to no documented history on file in the County Cultural Heritage Files.

The Survey program set up by the State provides an excellent example for the documentation of significant sites (buildings, monuments, etc.). The information requested on the forms can be readily used by planners and educators alike.

2. Educational Uses of the Survey

The Survey Forms and Report will be published and copies will be sent to the County Cultural Heritage Board, the Board of Supervisors, the City of Fillmore and the State Office of Historic Preservation for final approval. Copies will also be sent to the Ventura County Historical Museum, the Fillmore Historical Society, Moorpark College Library and the Ventura County Historical Museum Library.

A walking tour brochure is planned for Fillmore by the Fillmore Historical Society and the Chamber of Commerce.

When the Survey results receive final approval by the Board of Supervisors and the City of Fillmore, releases will be sent to the news media and there will be an attempt to have a feature story.

3. Planning Uses of the Survey

The City Manager's Office in Fillmore has been involved with the Survey since its inception. A member of the Planning Commission, Jeannette Anderson, served on the Review Committee. The City Hall Planning Staff will have a copy of the Survey results and a list of significant buildings on the Survey. Every attempt should be made to work this material into the planning process.

The list of potential National Register buildings identified in the Survey should be made available for the general public, including developers who may wish to rehabilitate them for commercial use. Information on the Tax Reform Act should also be made available.

The Planning Staff may also consider maintaining a copy of Rehab Right, published by the Oakland Planning Department, for use as a rehabilitation guide for homeowners.

Specific Recommendations

In the interest of maximizing the uses of the specific survey data, the following recommendations are submitted:

It is recommended that the Board of Supervisors and appropriate City Council, through recommendation of the Cultural Heritage Board:

1. Prepare and adopt a Historic Preservation Policy and Plan including specific policies and procedures for landmark designation and notation (signs) to guarantee consistency, accuracy and comprehensiveness for historical records.

This Plan would include policy of how the Survey data could be worked into the Environmental Review Process. Procedures would also be developed for appropriate Building and Safety Department files to be tagged with a system of denoting declared local, State and National Register landmarks.

- 2. Declare intent to review the list of potential County
 Landmarks identified by the Survey, Phase II, review the
 information regarding those potential landmarks and
 proceed with declaration of those potential landmarks.
- 3. Adopt a Historic District Ordinance.
- 4. Once appropriate ordinances have been adopted, declare intent to review the neighborhoods identified by the

Survey, Phase II, review the information regarding those proposed districts and proceed with the declaration of those proposed districts.

- 5. Some of the neighborhoods in the Survey Area that are considered potential historic districts are zoned for higher density use. Be aware that downzoning in these areas may be an important tool in their preservation.
- 6. Pursue the preparation of an informational booklet describing the existing County landmarks for use by the educational community and the public in general.
- 7. Prepare a map showing the local, State and National Register landmarks as well as the significant building listed on the Survey for use by public agencies.
- 8. Be aware and consider the use of Community Development Block Grant Funds, the Rehabilitation Loan Programs for structures within the Survey area and existing landmarks that have been identified as having significance.
- 9. Continue the Countywide Comprehensive Survey pursuant to the Methodology Report and Volunteer Program as contained in this Report and continue to pursue funding

from the State Office of Historic Preservation for its completion.

Potential Local Landmarks/Districts

The following is a list of potential County landmarks/districts recommended by the Project Review Committee (PRC). These structures are within the Survey Boundaries. This list is by no means inclusive and may be added to as necessary.

SECTION VI

CONCLUSIONS

Successes and Failures of the Survey

The biggest success of the Survey was the accomplishment of comprehensively inventorying and photographing the majority of structures in the Survey Area. This was possible only because of the enthusiastic hardworking volunteers who photographed all the buildings, did all the fieldwork and assisted with the research.

One failure of this project was the lack of time and volunteers to do more research on those difficult parcels where it was hard to locate an owner. The lack of records, such as building permits and Assessor's Rolls, made it difficult to locate original owners and information about them. Much of the information had to be gleaned from local residents and, in some cases, there was not enough time to do this.

Also, the grant amount was small (\$5,000), so that staff time spent on the project was minimal. About ten hours per week was devoted to the project with more time at the end to finish the report and write the final forms. It was difficult to maintain volunteer enthusiasm and to follow-up in the time period involved.

Another success was that this material collected and researched will be a great aid in identifying Fillmore's history. Very little has ever been written on the development of the City. The Survey has added to the historical significance of Fillmore and will be a useful document for the future.

Future Surveys

The Project Review Committee had identified several potential areas that remain to be surveyed in Fillmore and environs.

The area northwest of the City has several early residences built prior to 1900 and shortly after. They are located on Grand Avenue and the surrounding rural areas. Also, the south side of Fillmore, below Highway 126, should be surveyed.


Bardsdale had a preliminary survey done on a portion of the town with photographs and research sheets begun. Due to lack of time and volunteers, this project was not completed. It should be included in a future survey of this area, as should the town of Piru, which is a few miles east of Fillmore. The outlying rural areas should also be done between Santa Paula, Fillmore and Piru. Many old ranch houses and out buildings remain, including Rancho Sespe, all located off Highway 126.

Balance of County Area

Over the next five years, the area of the unincorporated territories of Ventura River Valley, the Ojai area, Moorpark/Simi Valley area, Thousand Oaks area and Port Hueneme area are all to be surveyed. These areas would be surveyed as the Countywide Comprehensive Survey continues.

A grant has already been prepared asking for further funding from the State Office of Historic Preservation for Phase III of the Countywide Survey, which would include Ojai.



SURVEY CRITERIA

The following criteria, based in part on the National Register Criteria, will be used to determine structures to be included in the State Inventory. A structure must meet one or more of the following criteria:

- Any building, structure, place or natural configuration that arts as a focal or pivotal point important as a key to visual quality or character of an area, neighborhood, or survey districts; or
- 2. Its identification with a person or persons who significantly contributed to the culture and development of the City; or
- 3. It serves as an example of a particular architectural style or period that illustrates the historical character and development of the City; or
- 4. Its identification as the work of locally or nationally known architects, craftsmen, or builders; or
- 5. Its location as a site of a significant historic event;
 or

- 6. Its embodiment of elements with attention to architectural design, detail, materials or craftsmanship; or
- 7. It remains in original condition and illustrates a particular architectural style or period; or
- 8. Its relationship to other landmarks or landmark districts if its preservation is essential to the integrity of the landmark district; or
- 9. Its unique location or singular physical characteristic representing an established and familiar visual feature or a neighborhood or community; or
- 10. It exemplifies the cultural, political, economic, social or historic heritage of the community; or
- 11. It relates to distinctive cultural ethnic groups.

On the west side of the house is a recessed front porch supported by square columns and massive porch beams. Under the widespread eaves are decorative knee brackets and exposed rafters.

The second story portion of the house is of shingles and is contained under the eaves whereas the lower portion is of medium clapboard siding. A massive stepped brick chimney on the west side of the house, punctuates the roofline and a slanted bay appears on the west side with a shed roof.





This large irregular shaped single story house has had various additions over the year. (It is alleged to have been moved from Catalina Island to this site c.1910 by the John McNab family. In addition to being a rancher Mr. McNab was President of the Fillmore Irrigation Co. in 1910-14, manager of the Sespe Land & Water Co. 1916-17. and Vice-President of the Ventura County Co-op. The Sespe Land & Water Co. owned much of the recent town of Fillmore.) The house was used as head quarters for Sespe Land & Water The intersecting medium gable roofs form an L-shape in front. An open porch runs across the front with a partial shed roof covering supported by square columns. A recent addition of brick steps and railing lead up to the front porch. This modest stucco cottage has a low pitched sidefacing gable roof with an offset swept gable forming an arched opening over the front entrance. A low stucco wall encloses the porch with wrought iron gate. Windows have geometric shaped multi-panes in upper portion. The house was built c.1927 and names associated with the property in later years were George Higgins, Cecelia Wiklund and Broderson.

Built after 1929, this later stucco residence is built in an L-shape with offset front gable and front porch supported by narrow wood lattice-type columns.

This courtyard of four Mediterranean style bungalows is the only bungalow court in Fillmore. The stucco residences have flat roofs raised at the corners and hipped tile roofs over the arched entrys. The wood frame windows have multi-panes in upper portion. The residences are surrounded by mature trees and have well manicured lawns. A variety of occupants have lived in the bungalows since they were constructed c.1926.

556-558 First Street

This stucco duplex, built c.1932, has a flat roof with an unusual stepped parapet. The double entrance is recessed between the two wings and a wing wall extends the roof line to the west of the building. Again, windows play a major design feature with emphasis on the vertical seen in the multipaned rectangular panels. Original owner is unknown but later names associated with the property are Oscar Massey and J.A. Culp.

Most residences have detached garages and a few have rentals in the rear or are multi-family residences.

	The 500 block of Kensington Drive is significant as a group of residences that maintain a consistency of style built primarily in the 1920's except for a few done in the 30's and 40's. Most of the residences are good unaltered examples of Period Revival and California Bungalow styles. Primarily a middle class neighborhood, some of the owners were retired ranchers while others were carpenters. There is a very old sycamore tree on the street that was here prior to the building of the city and a blacksmith shop used to be next to it.

Kensington Drive - South Side

518 Kensington Drive

53-043-11

One of two two-story houses on the block, this residence has had several additions on the rear and west side. The main front portion has a low pitched hip roof with exposed rafters under the wide eaves and wide board siding. The additions have gable or shed roof with medium narrow clapboard siding. The house is heavily landscaped with rock borders and brick sidewalk. The owners in 1926 were Glen W. Harmonson, Cashier at Fillmore State Bank.

522 Kensington Drive

Built c.1928, this residence has a low pitched hip roof with offset hip over entry. The entry is arched with an open porch on the east enclosed by low stucco wall. The windows have diamond shape panes in side panels. A tall stucco chimney with a pointed arch is located on east side. At one time O.C. Bukman, a carpenter, lived here.

528 Kensington Drive

53-043-09

Supposedly the first house built in the tract, this house was owned by Justin & Lottie Snow, ranchers, c.1924. The house is California Bungalow in style with it's low pitched gable roof over the front porch, exposed beams and rafters and massive stone pillars supporting elephantine columns. The house is covered with medium-narrow clapboards.

532 Kensington Drive

53-043-08

This Mediterranean style stucco residence has a flat roof with slightly pointed parapet which has raised square corners. An offset wing has a tiled shed roof over the arched entry with an open porch with low stucco wall on the east. Window treatments are major design influences with a three part arched window on the west and a three part rectangular window with tile trim above on the east. Built c.1926, this property was owned by Harold Balden, a rancher.

536 Kensington Drive

53-043-07

This two-story residence was built in the 1930's as 4 rental units. Set back on the lot, this stylized Colonial Revival apartment is surrounded by mature trees. The name associated with this property was Helen Sanderson.

Meant to resemble the English Cottage style, this stucco residence has an unusual shingled and thatched roof with heavy rounded thatched eaves. Built in a somewhat "L" shape with intersecting high pitched gable roofs, the front porch is open with a low wall. Multi-paned French doors and windows have an arched design element. A slanted bay is located on the east wing. Built c.1925, this house was occupied at one time by Aver Grimes. a rancher.

548 Kensington Drive

53-043-05

An unusual combination of high hip and gable roofs is found on this single story residence. The recessed front porch is supported by square capped columns and plain frieze above. The house is covered with wide clapboards and has a tall brick chimney. Built c.1926, this house is associated with Dwight Goodenough and L. Armstrong. A Mr. Jones who worked at the packing house is believed to have lived here first.

552 Kensington Drive

53-043-04

Built c.1945 this late English Cottage Period Revival stucco residence is constructed in an "L" shape with offset high gable roof. The roof sweeps down over the entry and is supported by a square column. Windows are multi-paned and rafters are exposed. A name associated with the property is Frank W. Howard, rancher.

558 Kensington Drive

53-043-03

This bungalow, built c.1926, has been completely remodeled and covered with stucco. It was built for Glen Stull, a teacher.

562 Kensington Drive

53-043-02

Another late English Cottage Period Revival style from the 1930's, this stuccoed residence has a high pitched side facing gable roof with offset gables on the east and over the entrance. The gables are sharply pointed and covered with shingles. Windows are multi-paned. The house was built by Edward S. and Goldie Rice in 1937. Mr. Rice was a carpeter. They still own the property.

568 Kensington Drive

This recent stucco residence has a gabled roof and brick chimney. The house was built in the 1950's for E.S. Grimes.

519 Kensington Drive

53-042-11

The steep-pitched side facing gable roof on this 1 1/2 story residence has a gabled dormer and offset front gable. Designed in the English Cottage style this stucco residence was built after 1929 and used multi-paned casement windows. A later name associated with the property was Theodor Baker, auto agency owner.

523 Kensington Drive

53-042-12

Built c.1927 possibly for Eliphalet Earhart, a clerk, this California Bungalow has two front facing gables with knee brackets and slatted vents under the gable. The offset porch has been enclosed and an addition appears on the west side. The house is covered with clapboard siding and the three-car garage in rear has units above.

527 Kensington Drive

The side facing gable has an offset front gable on this single story bungalow with exposed rafters and beams under the eaves. The porch is partially enclosed with multi-paned windows and the house is covered with stucco. Built c.1927, this house was occupied by Mrs. Carrie Guiberson.

533 Kensington Drive

53-042-14

Built c.1925 and occupied by Mrs. Octavia Goodenough, this 1 1/12 story California Bungalow has a medium pitched gable roof with shed dormer. The dormer has interesting knee type brackets and exposed rafters. The recessed front porch runs across the front of the house and is supported by recent wrought iron columns. Stairs have been added to the west side and an entrance put in on second story and the chimney has been stuccoed.

539 Kensington Drive

53-042-15

This Mediterranean style stucco residence, with it's low pitched red tiled gable roof, features a three part moorish arched window with multi-panes on sides. A segmented arched window with multi-panes is found on the east side with the entry in the center. An open porch has a low stucco wall enclosure. Built c.1926 and the name associated with the property was Ceasar T. Mumme who worked at the Community Service Station. Another name associated with this property was Aver Grimes.

This well proportioned bungalow displays Craftsman features seen in the tapered stone porch supports and porch wall. The upper portion of the columns is of tapered wood. Exposed beams and rafters are prevalent under the wide eaves. The house is covered with narrow clapboard siding. Built c.1925, the house was occupied in 1928 by Louis C. Mumme.

549 Kensington Drive

53-042-17

This well maintained and somewhat formally landscaped Mediterranean style residence has a low pitched gable tile roof with an offset front gable which is lower on the porch side and has a wing wall on the west side. Under the gable is a circular relief. The porch is open on the east except for a low stucco wall and wood gate. An aluminum awning has been added over the porch and front window. Windows have multi-panes and shutters. Built c.1925, the name associated with this property was Bismark Basolo, rancher.

555 Kensington Drive

53-042-18

Built c.1932, a later owner of this property was Annie V. Oliver, widow of John, a rancher. The exceptional window treatment on this Mediterranean style stucco residence provides a strong design element. To the west of the entry is a three part moorish arched window and to the east of the entry are three separate multi-paned arched windows. A raised open porch partially hidden by a low hedge extends from the entrance to the west side. Mature trees and shorubs compliment the house. There was a small house in the rear of this property prior to 1929 and the name associated with it was George C. Roberts, Assistant Manager of People's Lumber Co.

A one-story commercial block with two store fronts constructed c.1917 with glazed brick to match the adjacent bank building. Detail is not as fine, however; with simple terra cotta cornice and projecting belt cours. Scale is excellent match for bank. Storefronts show signs of remodeling, particularly in use of aluminum awnings and mosaic tile (c.1955). Early business, c.1918, was a hardward and paint store.

322-22½-24 Central Avenue

Smith's/Flower Shop/Lennarz Bakery

A one story commercial block with two store fronts constructed c.1915 of dark tan brick with bold light tan brick geometric detailing. Somewhat monumental parapet with stepped design in light brick. Transom lights over storefronts covered, one by corregated aluminum sign with projecting Moderne lettering (Smith's), probably c.1935. Storefronts at 322-22½ may be original. Early businesses, c.1918, were a grocery and dry goods stores. Design attributed to Homer Glidden, with Kreiter Bros., contractors.

328-30 Central Avenue

Smith's Other Place/Fabric Shop

A one story brick commercial block with two storefronts constructed c.1910. The facade at 330, with stepped parapet and cornice line with dentils, is evidently the unaltered original, while 328 has been completely remodeled. It may be surmised that the two were originally identical, 328 still showing some proportional similarity to 330. An original occupant was a bakery (c.1911), with an oven evident at the building's rear (330). This was the first brick building on this block and side of Central Avenue.

334 Central Avenue

Milums Stationary/Chiropractor's Office

A two story brick commercial block constructed in 1914 as Merritt's Pharmacy Block. A subtle string course with interspersed diamond patterns is used above the first floor, and other horizontal and vertical design elements in brick are creatively employed. A bank of four large double hung second floor windows with shallow ledges help develop an almost diminutive scale. The use of a deep cornice line supported by corbled brackets contributes to this effect. Aluminum awning and tiled storefront are only apparent alterations to an otherwise excellent and well preserved vernacular commercial building.

Towne Theatre/Palace Barber Shop/Terris Beauty Shop

A theatre and two shops built as one parapeted plaster over brick structure c.1915. A small marquee projects out over the entrance to the theatre, with an arch detail and exaggerated keystone above. Storefronts have transom lights above awning. Six sided ticket booth. Building appears to be little altered, except for tile storefronts and probable enlargement of marquee to partially obscure arch detail. The theatre was originally called the Barnes Theatre, managed by Merton Barnes, a judge, and owned by Leon Hammond. The theatre is a rare example of a small-town moving-picture house, the first and still the only theatre in Fillmore (although others have come and gone).

340-40½ Central Avenue

A one story stuccoed brick building, constructed c.1915 which has been the home of Briggs Hardwarde (now Briggs and Brogan) since 1936. The building was two stories until 1971, when it was damaged in the Sylmar Earthquake. Present alterations date from that time. Earlier uses are reputed to have been a dance hall (wood floor on second floor still intact under new roof) and a lunch room, billiard hall and three lane bowling alley.

A one story Spanish Colonial Revival commercial block constructed in 1929. Building has four individual store fronts. The design is a mild, tasteful interpretation of the Spanish Colonial style, relying on the use of fire shield cartouches in cast plaster arranged in a cornice line above the storefronts, and a mission tile roof. Only southern-most storefront show major alterations.

Aluminum awnings later addition. Originally constructed for C.W. Harthorne (Harthorne's Grocery), Hickey Bros. Hardware and Newcomers Shoe Store.

364 Central Avenue

A one store bank building of plastered concrete built in 1913 as the Farmer's and Merchant's Bank. The building is in the classical mode, with square engaged doric columns along both street facades and round engaged doric columns flanking the pedimented Central Avenue entrance. A frieze band below the cornice is decorated with alternating circles and triglyphs. The plain parapet is somewhat imitative of a formal pediment. The building exhibits no obvious alterations.

Fillmore Market

A one story stucco over brick commercial building constructed c.1910 as a General Merchandise Store. Overall design is simple with a truncated street corner entrance high lighted by a somewhat mission style paralet and expressed geometric design. Although the current stucco covering is new, it appears that the building has been stuccoed for some considerable time. The building was constructed by Richard J.B. A diminutive one story commercial building of uncertain vintage (after 1929), but with a c.1975 split-faced block facade.

Fillmore Post Office

A one story commercial building constructed c.1955 with two brick storefronts and tall panalized stucco parapet. Duard Gobel built the structure for the Post Office, with his jewelry store occupying the smaller storefront.

337-39 Central Avenue

Toppings Shoes

Two, one story commercial buildings. The structure at 337 has a modest brick facade, and appears to have been originally two stores (constructed c.1922). The date of the loss of the second story is unknown (after. 1929). The tiny building at 339 is stucco over brick, constructed c.1922.

A two story stuccoed brick building constructed c.1910, rendered not particularly architecturally distinctive due to alterations. Five double hung windows with shallow wills are on the second floor above storefronts, which may be original, and notable for use of terra-cotta tile. The building was used as a Paint and Hardware Store, with a Men's Club on the second floor (c.1918).

345 Central Avenue

Edmond's Furniture

A one story brick and wood frame building constructed c.1910 and used as the United Mercantile Co. and the Ventura County Co-op Association, which in 1918 occupied all the structures from 337 to 345. The building has been altered, with a corregated metal facade placed over what is likely an original brick front.

Central Market

A one story brick commercial building undetailed except for a simple corbled brick cornice line. Storefront altered. Constructed c.1915, and used for a Restaurant and Meat Market.

The elaborate Moorish entrance is the focal point of the oldest buildings on the campus. This building is a long rectangular single story structure of stucco with a low pitched gable tile roof. An offset gable is found over the high entrance which is extremely elaborate with the moorish arch and extensive Churriqueresque relief. The use of brick and tile creates geometric patterns. Recessed moorish arched windows flank the main entrance.

There are two buildings, one the Art and the other the Science Building and both are identical.





This flat roofed structure has a buff colored brick facade with white glazed brick trim. The trim divides the building into two units with separate recessed entrances and large plate glass windows. Built c.1920, the original owner is thought to be Paul Potter, a photographer. This California Bungalow has a medium pitched gable roof with exposed beams and recessed front porch on the south side with a pergola attached. House is covered with medium clapboards and has a small front entrance with flat roof with wood railing.

Characteristics of this California Bungalow are it's two frontfacing gables, it's massive elephantine porch columns and it's pergola across the front. Of unusual interest is the siding which has two narrow horizontal boards and one wide. Built c.1914, the original owner may have been Harry McFarland.

The only hipped roof residence on the block, this one and one half story structure has an offset gable with a small Paladian vent and shingle siding underneath. The eaves are boxed with triple brackets underneath. Windows have criss-cross panes in upper portion and siding is narrow clapboard. The large front pergola is a more recent addition. The house was built c.1905 and possibly moved here and may have been occupied by the Brickley's, early merchant associated with the Wineman Co. Judge Barnes may also have lived here. He was the proprietor of the Barnes Theatre on Central Avenue.

450 Central Avenue

Built c.1914, this one and one half story California Bungalow has a high pitched gable roof with large gabled dormer on the south side. A flat roofed carport extends on the south. The recessed front porch has been enclosed and there are crisscross panes in upper portion of main front window. A large pergola extends from the porch and is supported by Doric columns on concrete pillars. Notched beams are found under the wide eaves. A large diamond pane window is located on south side of house. The house was occupied in 1926 by Roy L. Bond, agent for Union Ice Co.

407 Clay Street

53-053-12

This single story California Bungalow, built c.1920, has a medium pitched gable roof with offset front gable over the porch. Elephantine columns support the porch with heavy beams and exposed rafters under the eaves. The house is covered with medium clapboard siding. There is another residence in the rear. The house was owned by Burl and Sara Jarrett in the early 1920's. Mr. Jarrett was a machinist.

411 Clay Street

53-053-11

Built c.1920, this modest California Bungalow is similar to that at 407 with it's offset gable roof over the front porch. Here, however, concrete and stucco pillars form the base of the porch with wood columns above. Exposed beams and rafters are found under the eaves and the house is covered with medium clapboards slightly flared at the base. In 1928 occupants listed were Jessie Reslay, a widow, and Fredonia Jones, beauty operator.

417 Clay Street

53-053-10

This single story California features three low pitched front gables. The offset porch is supported by massive elephantine columns, with pedimented beam and exposed beams and rafters under the eaves. The house is covered with narrow clapboard siding. Wood front door has window. The owner in the early 1920's was Ross Buckman, a watchman and tooldresser.

421 Clay Street

53-053-09

This single story residence built c.1920 has a medium side gable roof with fiberglass porch roof and wood porch supports. House is covered with asbestos siding and is located on the rear of the lot. In 1928, Clifford Mosbarger, a driver for Mosbarger Transfer Co., lived here.

425 Clay Street

53-053-08

This residence has one of the few hip roofs with a hip roof porch supported by square yellow brick corbelled columns and brick porch wall. Rafters are exposed under the eaves. Windows are double or triple with multi-panes. The front door is flanked by multi-paned sidelights. The house has two brick chimnies and is covered by narrow clapboard siding. The house was built c.1920 and was occupied in 1928 by Arthur E. Moorhouse, who worked at Clough's pharmacy.

This single story bungalow has a medium pitched gable roof and offset gable which may have been the porch and was enclosed and covered with board and batten siding. A flat roofed carport extends to the south. The house is covered with narrow clapboards. Built c.1920, the owner in 1926 of the house in the rear was Bradford Dresser who worked as a lineman for Pacific Telephone. This house was moved from the corner of Clay and First Street by Edith Jarrett after 1929.

435 Clay Street

53-053-06

This unusual single story residence is the only house built of stucco on Clay Street and has a basement with garage underneath. It was built by contractor Wendy Smith c.1920 for Leroy Vedder, auto operator, Ventura Refining Co. The house has a flat roof with brick pilasters which are raised slightly above the roof line. A curved arch of brick trim is found over the porch with the chimney on the south.

441 Clay Street

53-053-05

This modest bungalow has a low pitched gable roof with offset front gable over porch. Porch has been enclosed and there are exposed rafters and beams under the eaves. House is covered with wide clapboard siding. Built c.1920, this house was occupied by John L. Strickland in 1928. Mr. Strickland worked for a service station.

445 Clay Street

53-053-04

Built c.1920, this residence was occupied by George Strickland in 1928. The single story structure has a low pitched gable roof with lower gable across front and porch underneath. A combination of brick and wood elephantine columns support porch. House has exposed rafters and concrete brick chimney. There is a diamond shape window in top of front door and house is covered with clapboard siding.

449 Clay Street

53-053-03

Built of concrete and stucco c.1920 this California Bungalow has a low pitched sidefacing gable with a gabled dormer vent. The recessed front porch is supported by concrete pillars and low wall with wood capped columns above. Exposed rafters and beams are found under the wide eaves. The two chimnies have a decorative brick T-design at the top. The front wood door has multi-panes of glass in top.

53-053-02

455 Clay Street

Built c.1925, this Provincial style bungalow was occupied in 1928 by John Galvin, City Attorney. The low pitched side-facing gable has an offset front gable with three multi-paned french windows. The front entry portico is gabled with rounded arch underneath supported by elaborate scrolled brackets and recessed paneled supports with multi-paned windows on each side. The concrete porch is open with two low brick pillars next to steps.

Clay Street - East Side

400 Clay Street

This single story California Bungalow, built c.1920, has a low pitched front gable with offset gable over the porch which has stucco pillars and low wall with elephantine wood columns supports. House is covered with narrow clapboards which are slightly flared at the base. The main window is divided geometrically in upper portion. D. Goodenough appears to have been the first owner.

406 Clay Street

This California Bungalow has a cross gable roof with an offset front gable supported by tall stucco pillars, and elephantine columns above, similar to the house at 400 Clay Street. The porch railing has criss-cross wood balusters which are repeated in the fence. Siding is of narrow clapboards. The house was built c.1920 for Herbert E. Philbrook, grocer.

410-12 Clay Street

Built c.1920 and owned by the Harmonson family at one time, this California Bungalow has a low pitched sidefacing gable with a centered front gable over the porch. Square stucco pillars topped with elephantine columns support the porch. The house is a duplex with two front doors and divided symmetrically in a "U" shape. The house has been stuccoed.

416 Clay Street

This bungalow has three front facing gables with lattice work vent under the main gable. The front porch is under an offset gable supported by stucco and wood elephantine columns. Exposed beams and rafters are found under the eaves. Louvred shutters were added later. Geometric shaped windows are found in upper portion of window. The house was built in c.1920 and owned at one time by Ethel White.

Built c.1920, this bungalow was owned by Benjamin C. Klotz in 1928. Mr. Klotz had a cleaning establishment on Central Avenue. The house has two front facing gables with unusual cut out wood floral design under the gable. This detail is reminiscent of Victorian detail on houses built some twenty to thirty years earlier. The porch is supported by wood elephantine columns and the house is covered with medium-narrow clapboards.

424-426 Clay Street

53-054-19

This house is the only English Cottage style residence on the block, built c.1920 for Charles D. & Edith Moore Jarrett. Mr. Jarrett was a writer and laborer. The stucco house has a steep pitched shingled and gabled roof on the north that comes down quite low to the ground and another offset gable on the south. The arched entry is located between the two gables. The house has an arched main window with multi-panes. There is an apartment building in the rear.

430 Clay Street

53-054-20

One of the few California Bungalows painted in a dark color with white trim, this single story residence has three front gables with porch. The porch is supported by brick pillars and wood columns above connected by a low brick porch wall. Exposed beams and rafters are found under the eaves. The house was built c.1920 and owned by James E. Shiells in 1928.

434 Clay Street

53-054-21

Built c.1922 for John D. Singleton, a foreman for Southern California Gas Co., this bungalow has a hipped sidefacing gable roof with centered gable over the porch. Columns are wood square and capped at the top. Diamond shaped cut out vents are found under the porch gable which is boxed with a plain frieze. The porch has a simple wood railing with balusters set at an angle and there is a brick exterior chimney on north side of the house. The front door has sidelights.

438-440 Clay Street

53-054-22

This duplex, built c.1925, was owned by Wm. Clarke, a mechanic for John Opsahl Co., in 1928. The low pitched sidefacing gable roof has two small gables supported by knee brackets over the entrances and geometric shaped multi-paned doors. The duplex is covered with narrow clapboards. There is another residence on the rear of the property.

Built c.1925 this California Bungalow has a low sidefacing gable with a centered gable over the front porch which is supported by brick pillars and wood elephantine columns in upper half. Windows are multi-paned and siding is narrow clapboards. Leland Southwick may have been the first owner of this house.



The 400 block of Fillmore Street is comprised primarily of one or one-and-a-half story California Bungalows. The houses on the east side of the street have unusually large lots ranging from 50' to 100' wide x 140' deep. Those on the west side are The houses on the east side are larger standard 50' x 140'. more ornate bungalows. The houses on the west have low concrete curbs across the front lawns about 6" high. Most of the bungalows have concrete sidewalks leading up to broad front porches and wood or concrete stairs. Characteristics of these residences include gable roofs, open porches, clapboard or shingle siding, brick or stone chimnies and/or porch columns, wood doors with windows.

410-12 Fillmore Street

53-052-14 Construction Date: 1918-1923

This large two-story California Bungalow has a main low pitched side facing gable roof on first story with low centered front gable over porch. The second story rises above main gable and has a low pitched front gable roof. Exposed rafters and beams extend under the wide eaves. The house is a duplex and divided in the middle with two identical front multi-paned doors. Concrete steps and porch floor are flanked by two massive square concrete columns topped with wood elephantine columns. The house is covered with alternating wide and narrow clapboards.

The house was built between 1918 and 1923 for John F. Cullen and Ellen P. Cullen. Mr. Cullen was in the electric business.

416 Fillmore Street

53-052-15
Construction Date: Between 1918-23

Two medium pitched intersecting front gables extend from the main side-facing gable of this single story residence. Although primarily California Bungalow in style the house has been stuccoed including the tapered chimney. The open front porch is supported by square columns; curved at the corners, and has wrought iron stair railing. A porte cochere is located on south side of house. The house was built between 1918 and 1923 and owned by James Ipswitch, who had a billiard parlor in town.

420 Fillmore Street

53-052-16 Construction Date: 1940-50

This 1 1/2 story residence was built c.1940-50 with medium high pitched sidefacing gable and offset front gable. The house has been recently stuccoed and has casement windows and metal awnings with garage built into main structure.

426 Fillmore Street

53-052-17 Construction Date: 1911-1918

The medium pitched side facing gable roof of this single story well proportioned Craftsman Bungalow has a gabled dormer vent. The recessed front porch on the north is supported by a cobblestone wall and pillars on lower portion with wood square columns. The porch has been enclosed on the south. Behind the carport or porte cochere is a low gabled wing with entry. The house is covered with medium clapboard siding and has sharply pointed rafters and beams under wide eaves.

The house was built c.1914 for Benjamin and Rebecca Deardorff. Mr. Deardorff was a farmer.

436 Fillmore Street

53-052-18 Construction Date: 1911-1918

The medium high pitched sidefacing gable on this single story Craftsman Bungalow extends over the recessed front porch. Very similar to the house next door at 426, this porch has not been enclosed and has the cobble stone stair rail and porch wall with wood elephantine columns above. A large cobblestone chimney is located on south side and punctuates the roof line. A wrought iron stair rail has been added. The house is on a double lot. The house was built c.1914 for Warren J. Galvin who worked at the refinery and was a storekeeper. The house has remained in the family.

444 Fillmore Street

53-152-19 Construction Date: 1911-1918

This irregular shaped single story residence has a combination of intersecting gable roofs with an offset front gable over the porch which faces both front and side in an "L" shape. Brick railings, columns, and wall have elephantine wood columns in upper portion. Concrete walk and steps lead to raised front porch. The house has notched brackets under wide eaves and is covered with narrow and wide clapboards and wood shingles in the gable. The chimney is of red brick and the house is on an extra large lot. It was built c.1914 for George H. Capes, City Recorder and rancher. Katherine Capes was a music teacher.

450 Fillmore Street

53-052-20

Construction Date: 1911-1918

This irregular shaped single story California Bungalow has a low pitched gable roof with offset front porch gable. A covered porte cochere (later addition) extends from porch on south side and is supported, like the porch, with square clinker brick columns at the base and square wood posts above. The chimney is of clinker brick and the house is covered with shingles in a short and long pattern. The front door is dark wood with staggered narrow glass panes in upper third and french doors on south side of porch.

The house was built about 1914 for William E. Wagener, publisher of the Fillmore Herald.

458 Fillmore Street

53-052-21

Construction Date: 1911-1918

Built c.1914 for Ambrose Elsesser, this large 1 1/2 story California Bungalow has a medium high pitched cross gable roof. Above the recessed front porch is a dentil frieze with keystone in center. The porch has sespe brownstone foundation and columns and is enclosed on south side. On a raised slightly

flared foundation, the house is covered with medium clapboard siding and has a brick chimney.

Fillmore Street - 400 Block - West Side

401 Fillmore Street

53-051-14

The medium-high pitched gable roof of this single story bungalow has an offset front gable over the recessed porch. The porch has a native stone wall and a plain wood slightly arched beam with protruding short wood beams. There are exposed knee brackets and rafters under the eaves and horizontal vents under the gables. The house rests on a raised foundation, has a corbelled brick chimney and is covered with medium narrow clapboards. The house was built c.1915 probably for Louella Kerr, a physician in Fillmore.

407 Fillmore Street

53-051-13

The sidefacing gable roof of this single story bungalow has a double offset front gable with exposed beams and rafters. The recessed front porch, under the offset gable on the north, is supported by 3/4 square pillars covered with narrow clapboard siding and slightly smaller plain square columns above with decorative caps. On the south is an exterior corbelled brick chimney. The house is covered with narrow clapboards. Built c.1915 for Mr. and Mrs. Walter Booth, Mr. Booth was a tooldresser.

411 Fillmore Street

53-051-12

Built c.1915, this bungalow was occupied in 1926 by Michael J. Burgen, Manager of the Fillmore Club and insurance salesman. The compound sidefacing gable roof has an intersecting medium pitched centered front gable. The porch treatment is quite unusual. Under the gable is a decorative vertical vent design flanked by two knee brackets. The squarish columns appear to be of cast stone painted white except for the two middle columns which are circular rusticated cast stone. The house is covered with narrow clapboards and is on a raised foundation.

417 Fillmore Street

53-051-11

This single story bungalow has a broad front gable roof with offset shed roof over the recessed front porch supported by brick wall and brick columns. Decorative beams and rafters are found under the wide eaves. A brick chimney punctuates the roof line on the south side and has a square recessed design at the top.

417 Fillmore Street, Cont'd.

Built c.1915 for Mary Turner, a widow, and her daughter, Bessie Turner Erskine, the house remained in the family for many years.

421 Fillmore Street

53-051-10

The native stone chimney and porch pillars lend a Craftsman influence to this single story bungalow. The decorative narrow and wide clapboard siding and the exposed beams and rafters also show the influence of a fine craftsman builder. The house has a medium pitched side facing gable roof with offset front gable over the porch. The porch is supported by stone pillar bases with square wood columns on upper portion. A slanted bay window is located next to the porch. Built c.1915 this house was occupied in 1926 by James G. Ipswitch who owned the Fillmore Pool Hall.

427 Fillmore Street

53-051-09

This rectangular shaped bungalow has a main front gable and offset gable over the recessed porch. The medium clapboard siding is slightly flared at the base which is covered with brick. Brick is also used for the square 3/4 porch pillars and is topped with square wood columns. A more modest bungalow is located at the rear of this property. Built c.1915, this house was occupied in 1926 by Nicholas J. Lindenfeld who owned a grocery store on Central Avenue.

431 Fillmore Street

53-051-08

A gabled dormer window punctuates the roofline of this medium pitched sidefacing gable roof on this one-and-one-half story bungalow. The recessed front porch extends across the front of the house and is supported by square wood columns with curved brackets at the top and a slatted wood railing in between. Exposed knee brackets and rafters are found under the eaves and the house is covered by medium narrow clapboards. Built c.1915, this house is also attributed to Nicholas Lindenfeld whose occupation was manager of Ventura County Coop in addition to grocery store owner. He rented out this property.

435 Fillmore Street

53-051-27

This house is almost identical to the house at 431 with it's gabled dormer window and sidefacing gable over the wide front porch. The difference lies in the concrete porch posts and wall rather than the brick. The house was built c.1915 and occupied by Mrs. Rachel Evans Elkins Harmonson in 1926. The house has a corbelled brick chimney on the south side and was probably built at the same time and by the same builder as the house on the south.

441 Fillmore Street

Decorative diamond pane windows are found in upper portions of front windows of this one-and-one-half story bungalow. The porch is recessed under the main front gable and is supported by stucco or concrete pillars with tapered wood columns on upper third. The house is covered with narrow clapboards and on a raised foundation. This house supposedly was built by Nicholas Lindenfeld, a grower, for speculation c.1915 and occupied by Hattie McGregor in 1928.

445 Fillmore Street

53-051-04

One of the few shingled bungalows, this single story residence has two low-pitched front gable roofs with intersecting side gables. The front porch on the south is supported by massive concrete or stucco elephantine columns. Diamond pane windows add decorative detail and exposed rafters and beams are found under the gables. Front wood door has three long rectangular windows in upper portion. Built c.1915 for Chili Franklin, pool hall owner, this house was occupied in 1926 by Lloyd Adamson, a grocer.

449-451 Fillmore Street

53-051-03

Built as a duplex c.1915, this bungalow was occupied in 1928 by Isaac Polin and Alf Corrio. In 1926, Spencer J. Parson, oilworker, lived here. This house has a medium front gable with offset front gable over the porch. Simple square wood columns with plain wood porch railing. Exposed rafters and knee brackets are found under eaves and the house is covered with medium clapboards.

455 Fillmore Street

53-051-02

This modest bungalow, covered with stained wood shingles, has a low pitched gable roof with small recessed front entry. Exposed rafters are found under wide eaves. The house was built c.1915 for J.W. Gastrich, high school principal.



53-051-01

Built c.1915 for Dick and Clarence Sunquist, the house was rented in the 1920's by John Opsahl, owner of Packard and Chrysler Motor Cars on Santa Clara Street. This one-and-one-half story bungalow has a high pitched sidefacing gable roof with recessed enclosed porch across the front. The house is covered with clapboard siding except for shingles under the gabled dormer window. Exposed rafters are found under the eaves and an exterior brick chimney punctuates the roofline on the north side.

This modest bungalow has two front facing gables and is covered with medium clapboard siding. Under the offset gable is the front porch which is supported by two square posts and wood balustrade. Knee brackets and exposed rafters are found under the eaves. Built c.1914, this house was occupied by Virgil Jones in 1926.

609 Santa Clara Street

53-060-21

This single story bungalow built c.1910, may have been moved here after 1929. This modest residence has a gable roof with hipped gable over the porch supported by square posts and wood balustrade. Rafters are exposed under eaves and house is covered with medium clapboards.

613 Santa Clara Street

53-060-23

Built c.1915 and occupied in 1921 by Wm. R. Hulsey, ranch hand, this 1½ story California Bungalow has a medium pitched main front gable with recessed porch supported by tapered and capped wood columns. A slanted bay is located on east side and front windows have vertical multi-panes in upper half. House is covered with wide clapboards. Exposed beams and rafters are found under wide eaves and under main gable is a combination vent and windows.

619 Santa Clara Street

53-060-24

This residence was built c.1914 by and for Wm. S. Yeakle whose firm, Hastings and Yeakle, constructed many of the residences and important buildings in Fillmore including the Presbyterian Church (now Fillmore Bible Church) on Central and the masonic Temple on Central. The house is ½ stories with a side facing gable roof with shed roof dormer. The porch is recessed across front of house and supported by wood elephantine columns and low stucco capped wall. Decorative elements include the sharp pointed rafters and bargeboard under eaves carried out in detail above windows. Several trellises fills in open spaces on porch. House is covered with medium clapboards.

625 Santa Clara Street

53-060-25

Built c.1914, this residence and 619 were also owned by Yeakle. Yeakle is listed as living here in 1921-22 and at 619 in 1928. This single story residence has a sidefacing gable roof with intersecting front gable centered over the porch. Craftsman details include cobblestone porch piers and stair wall with capped elephantine porch supports above. A slightly arched beam extends between the columns. Pointed beams, rafters and pointed and tapered window mouldings, apparently a trademark of the firm, are found on the house which is covered with medium clapboard siding and shingles.

629 Santa Clara Street

53-060-26

Built c.1914 and owned by Harry J. Hastings in 1921-22, of the firm Hastings and Yeakle, this single story Craftsman Bungalow has the same stone porchwork columns as the house at 625. However, this house has two front facing gables and exposed beams

and rafters under the eaves. The exterior chimney on the west has been stuccoed. The house is covered with medium clapboards and shingles.

639 Santa Clara Street

53-060-28

Built c.1914, probably by Hastings and Yeakle, this $1\frac{1}{2}$ story California Bungalow was owned by Thomas W. Hampton, a fireman and laborer for Fillmore Citrus Fruit Association.

The house has a medium high pitched sidefacing gable with a slightly flared gabled dormer. This flair suggests the Oriental influence popular at the time. Notched rafters and bargeboard, knee brackets and elephantine porch columns are all characteristics of this bungalow which is covered with medium-narrow clapboards and shingles. The recessed front porch has low curved brackets under main crossbeam. Windows have geometric shaped panes in upper portion.

643 Santa Clara Street

53-060-29

Built c.1914 and occupied by both Fannie Bowie and Bella Nichols in the 1920's. This 1½ story bungalow has a medium pitched sidefacing gable roof with gable dormer and slanted bay window underneath. The recessed small front porch on east side has two front doors one with oval glass. Notched rafters and knee brackets are found under the eaves and dormer window is slightly arched with keystone. Siding is medium-narrow clapboard and shingles.

649 Santa Clara Street

53-060-30

This bungalow is identical to 639 Santa Clara Street except for front windows which have diamond shaped pattern in upper portion. Wooden steps and railing have been replaced with concrete and metal. This house was built c.1914, probably by Hastings and Yeakle and occupied by George P. Hanna, a driller.

659 Santa Clara Street

53-060-32

Built c.1924, this bungalow has a hip roof with recessed porch on west side supported by clapboard covered square column. Exposed rafters are found under eaves and house is covered with medium clapboards. A later name associated with this property was Edgar H. Robinson.

Santa Clara Street - South Side

618 Santa Clara Street

53-092-23

Built c.1914, the owner of this Craftsman Bungalow in 1926 was Minnie Flanagan. The house has a main sidefacing gable with



recessed porch on the east side supported by one large tapered column. Notched knee brackets are found under the eaves with exterior cobblestone and brick chimney on east side. House is covered with shingles. A vine covered arbor and fence surround property.

Built c.1914 for Harold Osborn, local physician, this house was used as his residence and office with two entrances. The main sidefacing gable has two street facing gables which are low pitched with sharply pointed bargeboards, beams and rafters under wide eaves. The front porch is supported by tapered columns on upper portion and slightly flared base. The house is covered with shingles and has a corbeled brick chimney. The same unusual window treatment with tapered moulding and pointed lintels found on the houses built by Hastings and Yeakle, are found on this house.

Newer house in front of lot, small older gabled structure at rear.

410 Saratoga Street

53-053-16

A one-story bungalow constructed c.1920 with a medium pitch front facing gable with porch under. Porch is supported by river stone elephantine columns, spanned by a semi-pedimented lintel. Door with diamond-paned window and a brick chimney. The house is known to have been occupied by Frances Rudkin, a rancher and salesman for the John Opsahl Co. between 1926-1928.

416 Saratoga Street

53-053-17

A one-story bungalow constructed c.1918, which appears to have been considerably altered. Original design features include low side facing gable and door with diamond pane windows and side lights. The house was apparently built for O.T. Clough, a pharmacist.

420 Saratoga Street

53-053-18

A c.1920 bungalow with a medium pitch front facing gable and porch inset on left. Numerous details appear to have been added recently, including victorian-style spindle and spool work on the porch. A pair of moderatly narrow double hung windows with dentils over are uncharacteristic, but appear original. Decorative partial fascia boards are also unusual. Siding is narrow clapboard. Earliest known occupant, c.1928, is George Palmer.

424 & 426 Saratoga Street

53-053-19

Two one story bungalows on one lot, both constructed, c.1920. The front house (424) has two offset low street facing gables, with porch under. Porch is supported by elephantine river stone columns. Rear house (426) is similar in design, but smaller and with slightly higher gable pitch, wooden porch supports and rail and dentil design on lintel. Unusual off-centered orientation of front house allows direct street access and visability to rear house, which is reputed to be a pre-fabricated structure built by Louis M. Henry, a real estate broker. The earliest known occupant (c.1926-28) of 424 is Geo. Yerkley, a fireman and contractor.

430 Saratoga Street

A bungalow constructed c.1920 with two medium off-set street facing gables, porch under. Decorative leaded glass pattern in transom windows. Earliest known occupant (c.1926-28) is Peyton Burke, a proprietor of Peyt's Garage.

434 Saratoga Street

53-053-21

A tiny gabled bungalow constructed c.1920, situated at the rear of the lot; composition shingle sided with several apparent alterations. May have been constructed as a "garage house" intended for eventual use as a garage for anticipated larger dwelling at front. Earliest known occupant (c.1926-28) is George H. Fleming, a machinist and employee of Peyt's Garage (see 430 Saratoga Street).

440 Saratoga Street

53-053-22

A bungalow constructed c.1915 with a side facing medium gable and low pitch gable dormer vent varandah across front. Odd wide-narrow-narrow-wide siding pattern characteristic to Fillmore. Earliest known resident (c.1926-28) is Isamiah Wileman, widow of Robert B. Wileman.

444 Saratoga Street

53-053-23

A bungalow constructed c.1915, virtually identical in all respects to the dwelling at 440, except for a slightly taller-pitched dormer vent, and the addition of a concrete chimney at left. Undoubtably the work of the same builder. The earliest known occupant (c.1928) is James Waggoner, an oil-worker.

450 Saratoga Street

53-053-24

A bungalow duplex constructed c.1915 with two low pitch off-set street facing gables with a prominent vertically slated vent. Two double french door entrances on small wooden porch. Odd semi-elephantine columns, and wide-narrow siding pattern. Earliest known occupants c.1928 are Jay Stork, a photographer with the Southland Studies, and Carrie Eames.

454-56 Saratoga Street

53-053-26

A bungalow duplex constructed c.1925 with a low pitch side facing gable roof and projecting eliptical portico supported by stick work and brackets, entrances under. Large fixed windows flanking with border lights. Narrow clapboard siding.

A corner bungalow with two pairs of intersecting medium pitch off-set gables, with brackets under eaves. A brick verandah wraps around the Saratoga and First Street sides. Brick elephantine columns support. The wrap-around verandah creates a strong corner orientation. The house was occupied beginning c.1928 by Lester Price, a rancher, and Mayor of Fillmore from 1936-38 and County Supervisor.

403 Saratoga Street

53-052-12

A one story bungalow constructed c.1915, with a single side facing gable, porch under, and large intersecting gabled dormer vent. Porch and elephantine columns are constructed of riverstone. Earliest known occupant (c.1928) is Henry B. Kays, the Deputy Tax Assessor for the Fillmore area.

407 Saratoga Street

53-052-11

A c.1915 "L" shaped bungalow with a main side-facing gable and smaller intersecting front facing gable, porch under. Porch and square columns are constructed of riverstone. Reputed to have been the first house to be built on the block, with Joe Schwartz the original and current owner. Mr. Schwartz was a cashier for the Southern Pacific Railroad.

413 Saratoga Street

53-052-10

A c.1915 bungalow with main side facing low gable and intersecting low gable, centered, with porch under. Porch lintel has applied dentils. Characteristic wide-narrow-narrow-wide siding employed. Reputed to have been built for George Palmer, a barber.

417 Saratoga Street

53-052-09

Virtually identical to the house at 407, except for the use of concrete elephantine columns to support porch. Reputed to have been constructed by Harry J. Hastings, notable Fillmore contractor (Hastings & Yeakle), for his mother.

423 Saratoga Street

53-052-08

A one story stucco mediterranean style house with a flat parapeted roof, plain arched doorway under a small clay tiled hip-roofed tower and inset porch left covered by a shallow shed roof. Arched wing wall on side yard. Constructed c.1929 by Earl Young, a maintenance man with the Fillmore High School.

431 Saratoga Street

Bungalow on double lot constructed c.1920 with medium pitch front facing gable, porch inset on right supported by brick piers. Unusual pattern of wide and narrow butt shingles in gable end. Prominent corbeled chimney at left. William Howard Price, Mayor of Fillmore 1926-28.

437 Saratoga Street

53-052-06

Bungalow constructed c.1915 unusual for it's medium hip roof and intersecting front facing gable, nearly pedimented in appearance, covering small porch. Supported by two double wood posts on brick porch rail. Earliest known occupant c.1926, is Chester Spangler, a pruner.

441 Saratoga Street

53-052-05

Bungalow constructed c.1915 with front facing medium gable Gable supported by a pair of triple with verandah under. wood posts on brick piers. Prominent double square attic vent in gable end. Composition siding likely alteration. Earliest known occupant c.1926 is Samuel White, a rancher.

445 Saratoga Street

53-052-04

A tiny dwelling constructed c.1915 at rear of lot with medium pitch side facing gable. Apparently heavily altered.

447 Saratoga Street

53-052-03

A small dwelling constructed c.1940 with medium side facing gable, porch inset at right. Narrow clapboard siding.

455 Saratoga Street

53-052-02

An "L" shaped bungalow constructed c.1915 with intersecting gables, the street-facing gable covering a porch and supported by wood elephantine columns on top of brick piers. Shingles under gable ends. French front doors. Earliest known occupant c.1928 is F. Charles Dunn, owner of Dunn Hardware. Construction attributed to Hastings and Yeakle.

461 Saratoga Street

53-052-01



Built c. 1933-34 for Marie Schibsby, a teacher at the Fillmore High School, this English Cottage style residence blends in with the Episcopal Church next door which was moved there in 1933 from Port Hueneme. This single story cottage has an intersecting high pitched hip roof. A portion of the heavily shingled roof comes almost to the ground net to the main entrance. A high pitched gable extends from the main roof and forms the recessed entry. A low brick wall encloses the open entry area. Windows are long and narrow and multipaned. Mature trees and curved walkway enhance the "cottage" feel of this house which was donated to the Church upon Mrs. Schibsby's death and is now used as rental property.







This modest single story bungalow has a recessed front porch on the west side, supported by simple square columns. A recent low cement block wall wraps around the porch. Bungalow characteristics include vertical board vent under gable, knee brackets and exposed rafters under the eaves. The house is covered with wide clapboard siding and louvered shutters, a later addition, flank the main front windows.



The main entrance to this long irregular shaped single story building is flanked by twin towers with vertical paneled walls and small tile gable roofs. A shed tile roof extends over the recessed arched entry with pointed parapet above. Elaborate tile and decorative brick work break up the plain stucco surfaces.

The grounds are immaculately kept with many mature trees and shrubs, and wide concrete sidewalks.

303 Third Street

A one story bungalow constructed c.1915 with one low street-facing gable with porch under. Wide-narrow-narrow verticle pattern porch rail design is repeated in attic vent. Door centered on porch is flanked by two large, square fixed windows. Gable is supported by large box columns topped by tiny elephantine dolumns. Foundation is brick. Composition siding likely alteration.

Original owner is unknown, although a later occupant, c.1928, was Tom Walsh owner or employee of the Auto Electric Service.

307 Third Street

50-154-16

A one story bungalow constructed c.1915 with a side-facing main gable and two smaller inetersecting off-set gables to the east. Projection of main gable covering porch is supported by large box columns topped by small elephantine columns. Clapboard siding is of an unusual alternating wide-wide/narrow-narrow pattern. Skirting is slightly flared over the concrete foundation. Rafters and ridge boards project slightly. A brick chimney pierces the deep eaves on the west side. Roof is composition shingled. Although the original owner of the house is not known an early occupant (c.1928) was Ross Wallace, a teacher for the County Schools, and his wife, Eleanor.

313 Third Street

50-154-17

A small, highly altered one story bungalow constructed c.1920 with a shallow side-facing gable and a tiny intersected medium pitch gable over the door supported by wood posts. Eaves are exposed. Stucco and used brick facade likely later alteration, perhaps c.1955.

An early occupant of the house (c.1925) was Christian Broderson, an oilworker.

317 Third Street

50-154-18

A one and a half story bungalow constructed c.1915 with a medium pitch side-facing gable and small shed-roofed dormer, centered. Full length porch is under main roof-line and features tall thin elephantine columns. Door and steps are roughly centered, with two large rectangular flanking fixed windows. Siding is aluminum to resemble wide clapboards with flared skirting over concrete foundation.

Although the original occupant is unknown the home's earliest recognized association (c.1926) is with William R. Bender, a driller.

323 Third Street

50-154-19

This bungalow, constructed c.1915 is virtually identical to the house immediately to the east, 317 Third Street, with the exception that the dormer is blind; two columns employed abreast of the door at 317 were not used here; and the windows flanking the door were divided into triple, double-hung bays.

The earliest known occupant of the house (c.1926) is M. Ray Maghew, a gasoline truck driver.

327 Third Street

50-154-20

A one story simple bungalow constructed c.1915 with a single street-facing medium pitch gable. A tiny porch is inset on the left. Medium clapboard siding flares at skirt line. A single double hung window and diamond-paned attic window are flanked by intersecting stylized shutters which repeat the diamond pattern.

The earliest known occupant (c.1926) is Robert L. Hays, a pipefitter for the Ventura Refining Co.

333 Third Street

50-154-21

An unusual one story c.1915 bungalow with a single street-facing low pitch gable; full porch under. Two large double-hung windows with tapered lintels arranged on either side of a craftsman-influenced door. Siding is a wide/narrow clapboard pattern. Porch is supported by elephantine columns; porch rail is an unusual horizontal stick pattern. A row of dentils extends across house above porch.

The earliest known occupant (c.1928) is William Crowner, an oilworker.

337 Third Street

50-154-22

This one story c.1915 bungalow appears to be similar in plan to the bungalow at 333 Third Street next door, but with a varied porch and roof arrangement. The home at this address has intersecting medium-pitched gables, one street-facing off-set with a small porch under. The wide-narrow clapboard pattern and window locations are similar to 337.

The earliest known occupant (c.1921) is Marvin Barnett, a driller.

343 Third Street

50-152-23

This c.1915 bungalow with main side-facing gable and small

inset intersecting gable is interesting for it's treatment of porch supports. Box columns terminate in sweeping archlike bolster. Medium clapboard siding is employed.

Walter Newcomer, a shoe merchant, occupied the house for at least eight years, beginning c.1921.

347 Third Street

50-152-24

A one-story bungalow with three very low pitched street-facing gables. A porch is covered by the main gable on the left; with porch supports of brick piers topped by small elephantine columns. Medium clapboard sidings. A pipe porch rail is a likely later modification.

351-53 Third Street

50-154-25

A one story c.1927 period revival "T" shaped stucco duplex with a street-facing medium pitch gable intersecting the clipped hipped roof. The nearly symmetrical facade has one double-hung window on each side of the front doors, which are arched plainly, one facing the street, the other side-facing.

357 Third Street

50-154-26

A one-story c.1945 "L" shaped ranch house with intersecting medium gables and shiplap siding. A shed-roofed carport projects from the house on the left.

363 Third Street

50-154-27

A one-story bungalow constructed c.1920 with nearly perfect symmetricality of elements. A tall medium street-facing gable has a smaller gable nested within. The door is placed in the middle of the porch contained under the small gable, flanked by large wondows. Siding is medium clapboards. The house was occupied in 1928 by Mrs. Lillian Brocker and William G. Brocker, driver for People's Lumber Company.





A c.1920 single one story bungalow with two low offset front facing gables, medium clapboard siding and two rectangular windows with tapered lintels. Door is side facing. The earliest known occupant (c.1926) is A. Howard James, a salesman, and his wife, Lillian.

407 Third Street

50-152-13

A c.1915 one story bungalow with a single low front-facing gable and prominent attic vent under gable. Notable for employment of characteristic wide-narrow clapboard pattern. Considerably altered c.1950 at left. The earliest known occupant (c.1921) is W. Montague Everitt, a jeweler at 336 Central Avenue, and his wife, Margaret.

413 Third Street

50-152-14

A c.1920 one story bungalow with two, low off-set gables, front facing. The rightmost gable projects with a low porch under, and is supported by large concrete elephantine piers topped with tiny wooden elephantine posts. Recently stuccoed. Earliest known occupant (c.1928) is C.W. Snodgrass.

419 Third Street

50-152-15

A single story c.1920 bungalow with a medium side facing gable and small centered intersecting compound roofed porch cover supported by an interesting bracket and lintel arrangement. Banks of three windows flank the porch. Siding is narrow clapboards. The earliest known occupant (c.1926) is Lloyd McCampbell, an oilworker, and his wife, Evla.

423 Third Street

50-152-16

A one story provincial style cottage contructed c.1930 with a side facing medium gable and an intersecting tall tongue-in-grooved sided gable offset to left. A prominent chimney balances the offset gable off-centered to the right, adjacent to the door. A pair of shuttered multipane double-hung windows and arched attic vent detail the street-facing gable. The house was occupied in the 1940's by Joe Scanlin, who worked for Texas Refinery.

427 Third Street

50-152-17

A one and a half story bungalow, constructed c.1915, with a medium pitch side facing gable and large dormer enclosing a glassed-in sleeping porch. A wide veranda extends across the

full front. Rather unusual proportions are created by the somewhat wide expanse of clapboards between the porch and roofline. A dense hedge obscures full view of the first floor. The house was owned by Charles F. Reeder, Manager of Peoples Lumber Co., from 1916-1928.

431 Third Street

50-152-18

A small, one story bungalow with a medium pitch front facing gable. Although constructed c.1925, the house has been heavily altered and shows little indication of it's original design.

437 Third Street

50-152-19

A one story home constructed c.1900 with a pryamidal main roof and a shed projection covering a porch. Porch is supported by piano-leg posts, with stick work underneath siding is narrow clapboard. The house was moved to this site sometime after 1929 from a location thought to be near the intersection of Central and Ventura Streets and belonged to Julius Baldeschweiler, a farmer.

441 Third Street

50-152-20

A one story bungalow, c.1915, with a porch wraping around the southeastern corner. Two low off set gables face the street, with a shed roof supported by posts covering the porch. Heavy rafters project under eaves. A weighty riverstone chimney is on the south side. A window arrangement consisting of a fixed window with a multipaned transom above flanked by narrow double hung windows is repeated in two locations. The medium clapboard siding flares slightly over the foundation. An early occupant c.1916 is known to be Wm. M. Chadsey, and his wife, Mary, ranchers.

447 Third Street

50-152-21

A one story bungalow c.1915 with a medium street-facing gable with a veranda underneath medium clapboard siding. House is largely obscured by mature cypress trees. An early occupant is known to be Jas. D. McLean, employed as a clerk (1916), a manager for the Ventura County Coop. Assoc. (1921), and a manager of the United Mercantile Co. (1928).






